

2022-2023 Scholarship Report

- 1. Winfield High School graduates who have indicated they plan to return to Winfield and/or are current residents of Winfield will be given precedence over WHS students, while recognizing they are doing well, who do not plan to return to Winfield or Kansas. Scholarships are awarded in a tiered fashion for Freshmen and Sophomores. However, once a student is a Junior and above, there are minimum award amounts which will vary from year to year dependent upon budgetary constraints. Additional weight is given to those who not only perform well academically but extramurally (working, volunteering, shadowing, extraordinary letters of recommendation etc).
- 2. The two plus years of distance/zoom education for students as well as the burnout felt by many in the healthcare fields is apparent. The number of scholarship applicants is stable, thankfully, but I plan to visit WHS a couple times this Fall to encourage retention amongst the Exploring Healthcare students. Moreover, our main Healthcare mover and shaker aka Rob Fields has retired (ok, semi-retired) and has handed his mantle over to Joe Woods. Joe plans to continue Rob's exemplary EH legacy. Anything we can do to assist in the transition will be gratefully and truly appreciated.






